



Health & Safety Policy

A Health and Safety policy is a legal requirement under the [Health and Safety at Work Act 1974](#). It ensures that all reasonable steps are taken to protect the welfare of tutors, students, and visitors.

1. Key Policy Objectives

- **Safe Environment:** Establish and maintain a healthy learning environment, whether in a dedicated centre, a student's home, or online.
- **Risk Management:** Conduct regular risk assessments to identify hazards and implement control measures.
- **Emergency Procedures:** Define clear protocols for fire, medical emergencies, and accidents.

2. Core Responsibilities

- **The Agency:** Responsible for providing adequate [H&S training](#), identifying risks, and maintaining any equipment provided.
- **Tutors:** Must take reasonable care of their own safety, follow the agency's lone working procedures, and report any hazards immediately.
- **Parents/Clients:** Responsible for ensuring the student's home environment is suitable and safe for tutoring sessions.

3. Physical Safety Measures

- **Environment:** The teaching area must be free of trip hazards like trailing wires and have adequate lighting and ventilation.
- **Equipment:** All electrical equipment (e.g., laptops, tablets) should be safe, well-maintained, and used according to instructions.
- **First Aid:** Tutors should be aware of the location of first aid kits and the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations (RIDDOR) for serious incidents.



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4. Lone Working and Home Safety

- **Verification:** Tutors must never enter a home if a student is alone; an accompanying adult must be present for the duration of the session.
- **Safety Protocol:** Tutors should keep their mobile phones switched on and ensure someone knows their location and expected return time.
- **Trusting Instincts:** Tutors are supported in terminating a session and leaving immediately if they feel uncomfortable or threatened for any reason.

5. Online Health and Safety

- **Platform Security:** Use secure, agency-approved online platforms with encrypted communication and privacy settings.
- **Display Screen Equipment (DSE):** Tutors and students should be aware of safe screen use to avoid eye strain or ergonomic issues.
